The Head of Buddha has tight snail-shell curls leading up to a traditional crown of hair (ushnisha) and perhaps to a flame-like element projecting above the head (broken from this piece)Thai depictions of Buddha often featured this flame, the equivalent of the halo in the Christian tradition It symbolizes the emanation of light from the Buddha
